From the Secretary's desk.

Wow hasn't the 2017 show season been a good one for Orpingtons.

As you will see from this Outlook which is Our National Show report special the quality of both Large and Bantams on display has been outstanding. Up north in QLD a resurgence in recent years has seen good numbers on show, out in the west (WA) thanks to some energetic



younger members the quality Orps is getting back to somewhere close to those shown in the legendary Cliff Saggers day's. The more established states of VIC and NSW are also undergoing some change ups with lots of relatively new converts to the breed exhibiting this magnificent fowl and in SA and TAS there are a few stalwarts keeping the breed in the public eye.

As many of you will know I am limited to only attending Orpington Shows each year with the National a must followed by a Royal and a Feature. The very nature of planning, plotting, preparing and presenting birds at these shows is a big part of keeping this magnificent breed. A bigger part of that attendance however is the people who make it such a pleasure to make it off of the farmlet /out of the office. As Simon our proud Pres often states we are one of – if not THE- friendliest National Breed club(s) around. We are lucky to have some passionate and proud members who care deeply for the breed, who are happy to share good stock with new and old members alike, who are highly experienced and open to sharing that experience in a way that is a not confrontational, who love sharing the success of others in the show pen.

As you would have also read in my 2017 AGM report like many other institutions the Orpington Club of Australia is facing a few challenges. We have a 1000+ face book followers but less than 100 paid up members of which around only 40 or so show their birds on an irregular basis. Those members live in all states but our National Show is really only accessible to a few. There are new colours of Orpingtons being developed at rapid pace but the gene pool of the standard colours is rapidly diminishing.

From discussions before and during the Clubs 2017 National Show and AGM it was agreed by those present that we consider how to build the Clubs connection and relevance and at the same time ensuring the reasons why the Club was formed in 1986 were honoured, maintained and developed.

Firstly our physical structure was updated to reflect that while our National Show is the most important date of the Orpington year we need to do more to develop local/state links. Following the 2017 AGM we now have state reps in WA, SA, TAS, QLD, NSW and VICall their details are on the Club page- who will both inform and input into the development of the newly initiated National Orpington 3P's Breed Plan- which is the second major change- and which all members will have the opportunity to develop further and hopefully support.

The 3P's stand for Preserve, Promote and Protect which are the foundation pillars upon which the Club was formed and it makes sense for the Breed Plan to reflect them.

So far the 3P's Breed plan has been developed through initial discussions between the National Executive and State Reps.

Those discussions have clarified the role of the State Reps and four interlinked points of focus for the 2017-18 Orpington Year.

For your information the role of the State Reps has been drafted to read;

- Organising the State Orpington Feature shows.
- Visiting the yards of Orpington breeders and showing some interest locally.
- Helping with the running of the National show!
- At all times promoting the National Show as "the event bigger than Xmas day in the Australian Orpington Calendar"
- Helping the National Exec where ever possible.
- Being available to the state membership and breeders.
- Develop a knowledge of the main breeding lines, so that the Club is in a position to link people with birds they may need to improve their breeding program.

The 3P's Breed Plan is looking at the National and State Show scheduling, the quality of judging of Orpingtons and growing a sustainable, interested membership.

So for the 2017-18 Club Year the actions include;

- Achieve an entry of 300 birds at the 2018 National Orpington Show at Dubbo on Saturday 30th June 2018.
- Support/Provide & Promote at least one feature show in each of SA, Tas, VIC, NSW, QLD and WA state as part of an overall Show Calendar that complements the National Show date (and fits with the states show/breeding season) see the 2018 show date section in this newsletter for the latest updates.
- Set in motion an agreed 2018 Judging panel. We also hope to organise a state based judging school from which specialist Orp judges can be invited to judge at shows where the Club has opportunity to nominate and from which the National Show Judge (s) should be appointed from.
- Set a target of 40 Financial members and 80 Outlook Online Subscribers for the 2018-19 Club year (2016-17 final total of Financial members was 81). Probably this is the hardest area for the Club to progress in and some of the suggestions to date have been and need to be -quite bold as it impacts on both the Clubs financials and governance.

Having carefully considered budget and governance implications it is proposed that in addition to the Club having a Financial Membership option we will now introduce a separate online only e-news subscription. Effective from 1st January 2018 – the date that all financial membership applications & renewals take the member through to 30th April 2019- it is proposed that the Club offers an online only e-news subscription option for the Orpington Outlook.

Set at \$10 per financial year the subscriber would receive up to 4 editions of the Clubs enewsletter during this period.

All online subscriber fees will fall due on the 1st May annually- this consistency of date will make administration simpler.

As per the current constitution only financial members can serve as a Club Office bearers and enter the National Orpington Show. In addition full financial members will receive Outlooks (either online or printed) and a discount and/or priority access to any Club merchandise.

The annual Financial membership fee for 2018-19 will remain at \$20 – with an online subscriber being able to upgrade for \$10 should they enter into the National Orpington Show that year or wish to vote on Club matters etc.

Junior fees will remain at \$10 per annum and will receive full financial member benefits – without the AGM voting right.

The 3P's working group has tried to consider these initiatives from a range of perspectives and we have general agreement that the Club can't go on the way it is and be true to its original principles By adopting the online world in an attempt to build a broader reach the Committee hopes we will build greater engagement with the broader Orpington keeping community. Nothing ventured nothing gained!

National Orpington Show Judges Comments.

As taken by the Club Secretary ad verbatim from the Judges (Kim George) comments made to the pre AGM audience.

Thank you to the Orpington Club of Australia for the honour of judging the 2017 National Orpington Show and to the harden PC for their wonderful hospitality. Having seen the development of the breed in recent years I was hoping to handle some excellent specimens and I wasn't disappointed.

Overall the Large Blacks were the best colour on display with great evenness throughout and it was from here my Champion bird came from. In a big class of high quality birds the winning Large Black pullet was put down to perfection and with great size shape feather quality and

colour stood out on the day. Deservedly Champion Bird of Show. Quality was throughout the Cocks, Ckls and Hens too and the placings could easily have changed on another day.

Generally the Bantams were in better feather than the large fowl which showed with Bantams taking out the champion colour award in Blue, Buff, Cuckoo and Splash. The Champion bantam (Black) was within a feather of taking out the bird of show award.

Large Blues were fairly even if not outstanding. They would be even better if the quality of lacing present on the Bantams could be transposed onto the Large fowl. The two winning bantams were as good as I have seen while the Champion Large Pullet was very well presented.

Similar comment to the Large Buffs where the depth of quality dropped off quite quickly after the carded birds. Variations in eveness of colour as well as narrowness of body was a real issue. The Buff Bantams were outstanding in colour and type.

Whites were very nice in both Large and Bantam and the owners should be congratulated on their excellent presentation and the gains they have made in this Orpington colour. The Bantam Ck took out best prepared and presented bird in show and is an example of how a bird should be penned.

Cuckoos were only in Bantam and were average examples of the colour.

Splash showed too much gold particularly in the Large with the winning Bantam a good example of an Orpington in this colour.

The AORC were dominated by Lavenders in both large and bantam. Again the owners are to be congratulated on the huge stride they have made to get the birds to this quality. They are looking like Orpingtons and have overcome some of the feather quality and colour shading issues this colour has in other poultry breeds.
